<i>Questions</i>	<i>Answers</i>
Whats been changed?	Only the name. The staff, the service, and everything else remains the same.
Whats the reason for the change?	Key Assets is bringing current and planned disability services under a national service which will be called Key Assets Disability Services.
I am an Allied Outcomes participant. Will it change my services?	No. The only change is the name, from Allied Outcomes to Key Assets Disability Services
Will there be staff changes?	No. The only change is the name, from Allied Outcomes to Key Assets Disability Services
Has Allied Outcomes been bought out, or taken over by Key Assets?	No. Allied Outcomes was always part of Key Assets. The team was given a different name when it first commenced as our first NDIS service. However Key Assets is now establishing a national disability services team which will simply be called Key Assets Disability Services.
What about the organisation's NDIS registration?	Allied Outcomes is not registered name with NDIS. Key Assets Australia is the registered name.
What about the Allied Outcomes website?	A redirect will be set up diverting people to the Key Assets website and explaining the name change.
